New DfE Covid guidance

From today, guidance on whether children should be at school if they are ill has changed again. It now reads as follows: *'children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough to attend.'*

There is no need to arrange any kind of test for your child from now on but if they were to have a positive test (LFT or PCR) for some reason, the advice for children is to stay at home for at least three days and until they no longer have a high temperature.
