Uniform Policy

1. General Information

All children must wear grey or black trousers, skirts or pinafores, white shirts/ polo shirts and royal blue jumpers (V-neck or round-neck) or cardigans.

In the warmer months from Easter through to October half term, blue and white gingham dresses can be worn and trousers can be replaced with grey shorts.

Sensible predominantly black shoes must be worn that children can do up themselves, no boots.

White, black and grey socks and tights must be in keeping with the uniform.

A blue and yellow striped tie can be ordered from Maisies if your child wishes to wear one.

All clothing should be named.

We would prefer children to wear jumpers or cardigans with the school logo but this is not compulsory. Uniform with the school logo can be purchased from Maisies superstore uniform suppliers <https://www.maisies-superstore.co.uk/>

During the winter months a warm coat must be provided and sun hats are advisable during sunny spells.

2. P.E. Kit

P.E. kit consists of blue shorts and white t-shirt and trainers or plimsolls (trainers preferred). As your child moves up the school they will be doing more of their P.E. outside and it is often helpful in the wetter times of year to have a separate pair of outdoor trainers.

P.E kit should include a spare pair of socks. Tights are not permitted to be worn during P.E.

We also ask that children are provided with a dark coloured tracksuit to keep them warm during outdoor lessons in the winter months.

P.E. kit should be kept in named bag which can be hooked onto a peg.

Full P.E. kit, including P.E. bag can be purchased from the Maisies website.

3. Jewellery

For health and safety reasons we do not allow children to wear jewellery in our school.

The exceptions to this rule are:

- Ear-ring studs in pierced ears;
- Small objects of religious significance, such as a crucifix on a chain or Sikh Kara
- Watches as long as they are not a distraction to the child's learning
- Silicone value bands awarded in Star Assembly and/or one other charity band that is current e.g. for Remembrance Day

Ear-rings should either be removed or covered with surgical tape during P.E, games or swimming which must be provided by the parent. Other permitted items should be removed.

The school advises parents who wish their children to have their ears pierced to do so at the beginning of the school holidays.

Medical identification bracelets may be worn by children who have significant medical problems, e.g. Diabetes or epilepsy.

4. Hair

Hair below shoulder length should be tied back.

Accessories of an appropriate size and discreet nature can be worn and in keeping with the school colours.

5. Forest School Kit

Weather appropriate clothing should be worn.

Long sleeve tops and trousers must be worn at all times.

During wetter weather a waterproof jacket, waterproof trousers and wellies must be worn. Children should also bring a separate plastic bag to take wet / dirty clothing home.
